Responsibilities and Tasks of Being a Parent Volunteer:


- Costume Management: Ensure all children change into their correct costumes before the performance.

<u>KEEPING BELONGINGS TOGETHER</u>

It is recommended students bring a clearly labelled tub or wide washing basket to hold their bags and belongings in. Make your own little pack of supplies such as - extra hair spray, gel, hair elastics, bobby pins, safety pins and make up for touch-ups as required. Please ensure any medication required is packed and clearly labelled with instructions for the helpers.

FOOD AND DRINK

Costumes are easily ruined by food and drink stains, please WEAR your WPAS Jacket or a 'cover-up' for when students need to eat a snack. Bring plenty of nutritious snacks and meals to keep energy up – please, NO fast food etc. Please have water bottles labelled. There is a cafe at the Complex however it's not all guaranteed what they have available but can be a last resort if needed.

A Stage rehearsal takes place of our usual studio classes, with full hair & makeup (but no costumes). The objective of this rehearsal is to run the full Wonderland Production in its full 'flow' for the first time so students understand how the show works and get to watch each other for the first time! This rehearsal is on the big stage at the Wiigulga Sports Complex! We encourage parents to drop off their child once signed in and arrive at the pick up time - if you would like to stay for rehearsals & help with the shows you can sign up to be a Volunteer Parent Helper!

TECH REHEARSAL @ WIIGULGA COMPLEX SATURDAY 30TH NOVEMBER

A Technical rehearsal is where we practise our Production with lights, sound and sets and practise in full hair & makeup and costumes. This is the rehearsal that has all of the elements of the show that students will perform with on the actual day. This rehearsal allows students to feel what its like to dance and sing under stage lighting and with added surroundings like set pieces and extra tech equipment. WONDERLAND HAIR & MAKEUP

Stage makeup isn't about trying to make our little ones look 'older' and 'mature.' It's all about enhancing your child's features to match the heightened colours in their sets, costumes and lights around them so that their expression doesn't get lost. Bright stage lights can wash out facial features, making it hard for the audience to see expressions. Makeup helps define the face and enhances visibility from a distance. It also allows performers to embody their characters more fully and learn the process of being a performer onstage!



There are lots of brands that use mineral ingredients and free from toxins and chemicals which are a great option for stage makeup - these are best purchased from a chemist as the supermarkets can be limited. Nude by Nature and INKA are some of the regular brands

MAKEUP STEPS	TIPS
1. Foundation & Concealer (Boys & Girls)	Foundation Tip - If you feel foundation is heavy for your child's face, use a BB cream and 'build' it up. Make sure their foundation isn't lighter than their skin tone as the stage lights will naturally brighten their face. Keep it at their current skintone or a slight shade darker.
2. Eyeshadow (White, tan, gold) (Girls)	Warm Brown Eyeshadow on eyelid, white eyeshadow blended underneath the eyebrow into the brown. Gold or Shimmer can then go over the brown eyeshadow <i>Blending Tip - Use a fluffy eyeshadow brush in small circular motions</i>
3. Black Mascara + Eyebrows (Girls & Boys)	Mascara Tip - have your child close their eyes. Pull up the eyelid gently to apply mascara to the lashes whilst their eyes are closed. If eyebrows are quite fair, use a natural eyebrow pencil colour to darken them only by a shade or two
4. Black Liquid eyeliner (For Jnr / Inter / older students)	Apply Liquid Eyeliner on the top of eyelids finishing slightly off the eye and in an upwards flick
5. Blush / Bronzer (Girls & Boys)	Gently apply pink blush to apples of cheek and extend to hairline. If you have a bronzer / brown tone blush you can also apply this if you feel confident as a contour. Have your child suck in their cheeks and make a fish face, then follow the line underneath their cheekbone.
6. Bright Red Lipstick / Lip Balm (Girls & Boys)	For girls - Because the lights and our costumes are bright and colourful, wearing a bright lipstick enhances our features with the setting of being onstage without having to add any heavy makeup. Lipstick Tip - for longer wearing, choose a matte lipstick with pawpaw on top so lips don't dry out but the colour doesn't move. Boys - Boys to wear pawpaw / lip balm
HAIR FOR BOYS / MALES	TIPS
	Depending on their comfortability, as long as Boys hair is away from their face that's the most important thing! We encourage boys to style their hair for performance regardless of their hair length (you don't have to cut it shorter if they like it longer.) If their hair is long enough to tie back, you can tie it back and under itself like a bun tuck / 'man' bun.

HAIR STEPS FOR BUNS	TIPS
1. Unwashed hair = best	You would think that having freshly washed hair for a bun is the key however hair that is unwashed and has a little 'grit' in it from a day or two before is the best condition for styling your child's hair.
2. Wet / Dampen Hair	Wet or dampened hair works best. Spray their hair with a spray bottle of water before brushing their hair
3. Gel	Gel is your friend! Add a little gel to the top and sides to their hairline, where the fly aways tend to escape from. Now brush their hair back, brushing any excess gel into the wet hair
4. Brush Hair Back	Use a "smoothing brush" or comb to brush hair into a ponytail. Regular brushes with plastic bristles create separations in your hair and aren't a smooth brush. Any brush with close bristles will brush hair back uniformly and back into a ponytail. When you tie their hair back, make sure the ponytail is in a diagonal line with their chin so that the bun placement isn't too high or too low.
5. Hair ties & Pins Junbo Pin Junbo Pin Hendrick Regular Pin Mini Pin Heir Pin Hendrick Minister Pin Hendrick	When you put their hair in a ponytail, use an elastic that matches their hair color and blends in. If you use a colored hair tie, it may be seen under the stage lights.Bobby pins should match hair color too! Blondes, don't use black pins. Brunettes, don't use blonde or metallic pins. Not all bobby pins are the same Find a pin that suits their hair type. Smaller pins are better for thin hair. Long jumbo pins work best for thick hair.
6. Twist the ponytail into a bun!	Twist your ponytail into a rope and wrap it around the hair tie. Be sure to pin the twisted ponytail to your head as you wrap it around. When you bobby pin your bun, pin your hair like numbers on a clock.
7. Hairnet to lock it in place	Don't forget a hair net! Select a hair net that is similar to your natural hair color and wrap it around the bun after you've pinned it. For dancers with layers in their hair, this will help keep the shorter layers tucked down and not sticking up all over the place. You can also reshape the bun at this stage if it hasn't pinned in a great shape Leave the hairnet tight around the bun and re pin the hair to create the shape
8. Hairspray	Seal the deal with a small spritz of hairspray to keep it from moving around and getting messy during costume changes.
